



Grow Our Own Proposal 2024-2025

Overview

The Grow Our Own (GOO) program aims to bring together local business owners, education and employment providers and government agencies who seek to inform and inspire high school students and early school leavers with opportunities to live, learn and earn in the Southern Inland region of NSW.

Regional Development Australia Southern Inland (RDASI) has been successful in establishing a recognisable brand that advocates for our region's youth, connects aspiring employees and business owners, and develops and supports learning pathways into local careers.

Background

In 2016, in response to a growing concern that workforce shortages were creating an impediment to business growth and expansion, Deakin and Bendigo Bank formed a national partnership to improve the level of education participation and skills retention in regional communities.

Soon after, a national workforce development pilot program launched in western Riverina (NSW), with our peer committee, RDA Riverina, a founding member. A working group consisting of representatives from 16 businesses, industry, education, and employment organisations was formed to guide the development and implementation of the program.

In 2017, the group grew to 25 representative organisations, from which a steering group was formed. An action plan was developed and by 2018 Grow Our Own was also officially imbedded in the RDA Riverina Workforce Plan.

Grow Our Own attracted the attention of NSW Department of Education and, in 2019, an opportunity to further fund the program was made possible through the STEM Industry School Partnerships Pilot Program (SISP), of which Southern Inland became a pilot region, creating one of the key successful outcomes with



Crookwell High School, by establishing the Crookwell Academy of STEM Excellence. In the same year, RDA Riverina took on the management of Grow Our Own.

Attracted by the overwhelming success of the program, RDA Southern Inland (RDASI) ran a pilot program in the Goulburn-Mulwaree Local Government Area (LGA), intending to promote a variety of occupations and opportunities through workplace and educational facility visits.

Through our partnerships with government, educational institutions, businesses, and community organisations, RDASI connected participants to local employers to develop and retain a skilled workforce. Participants gained valuable insights into the career prospects available to them through industry visits and onsite interactive activities. From just one event (minimised due to covid) 15 applications were taken by the partner employer.

Regional Development Australia - Southern Inland

<u>RDASI</u> is part of a national network of committees across Australia. These committees are made up of local leaders who work with all levels of government, business, and community groups to support the development of regional Australia.

We are a Board of local leaders and staff, passionate about the communities we live in and committed to the RDASI vision - that the Southern Inland region is the most desirable place in NSW to invest, work, live and play by 2025.

2024 Boundary Change

Following a review in 2023 by the Hon Kristy McBain MP of Regional Development Australia (RDA) boundaries in NSW, the ACT and Jervis Bay Territory, a restructure will take place that will impact the Southern Inland region. RDA Southern Inland and ACT will merge, and include two Far South Coast local government areas (LGAs) to form RDA Southern NSW and ACT (RDASNA).

Moving forward, the RDASNA region will represent 9 NSW LGAs, including Wingecarribee, Goulburn-Mulwaree, Upper Lachlan, Hilltops, Yass Valley, Queanbeyan-Palerang, Snowy Monaro, Eurobodalla, and Bega Valley, plus the Australian Capital Territory, making it an incredibly diverse area.

These new arrangements will officially commence on April 1, 2024, with our current service delivery contracts remaining unaffected throughout the process.
